I am currently the Buder Center Director of Research, Faculty Scholar in the Washington University Institute for Public Health, Director of Community-Academic Partnership in Addiction, Faculty Director of Native Communities in Center for Social Development and a Faculty Director with the Collaboration on Race, Inequality, and Social Mobility in America. I try to investigate best ways to implement science and data into clinical substance use disorder services. Being a first generation, non-traditional, underrepresented minority student, I am troubled by this population's college dropout rates and try to intervene on that problem. I have remained on the all-time worst selling book list and during my free time, I find opportunities to pay down my student loans by providing services through my business, *Wolf-Fire LLC*.
